

Master in Human Assisted Reproductive Technologies

This document outlines the terms and conditions relating to the internship allocation process.

Mandatory internships

The completion of professional internships is a compulsory and integral component of the programme. Enrolment in the program is conditional upon full acceptance of this requirement. Failure to comply may result in academic consequences, including but not limited to non-completion of the programme.

Allocation and scoring system

Internship allocation shall be determined based on objective and discretionary criteria, including:

- Academic performance in the programme, specifically the score achieved in the first exams.
- Demonstrated language proficiency in English or the language of the destination country.
- Visa status and legal authorization to reside and/or work in the host country.
- Special personal circumstances, such as dependent family responsibilities or duly documented medical conditions.

* Certain internship locations may have additional specific requirements, including but not limited to minimum language proficiency levels or academic prerequisites, which will be communicated through the official Internship guide.

Visa and legal responsibility

Candidates are solely responsible for obtaining and maintaining any required visas, permits or authorizations, including Spanish Social Security Number (NUSS), for internships in Spain. The institution cannot guarantee visa approval or legal eligibility in any destination country.

Internship placements

Internship placements are subject to availability and eligibility and the list of destinations might change each year depending on availability of the Eugin Group clinics. Eugin Group is solely responsible for assigning internship placements in accordance with the requirements and criteria set out in this document and in the Internship Guide. These assignments will be communicated to students by November '26 and will be final and binding.

For reference, some of the countries that could be offered are the following ones: Spain, Portugal, Italy, Sweden, Denmark, Argentina and Brazil**.
